Expenditures include \$161,000 out of district tuition and transportation, charter school tuition, a new

Interventionist position, and summer custodial help. Staff that were hired in 2017-18 but not budgeted in 2017-18 will be maintained and budgeted in the 2018-19 school year-Media specialist, 3 paraprofessionals, social worker.
